EVOLUTION OF THE ESSENTIAL MEDICINES LIST (EML) REVIEW PROCESS AND PRIORITISATION

- The Terms of Reference of NEMLC allow for the establishment of subcommittees. The following two subcommittees have been established, both reporting directly to NEMLC:
- Asthma Subcommittee: The remit of this Committee will be to progress work on two outstanding PICOS for the management of asthma.
- *Endocrine Subcommittee:* The remit of this Committee will be to initially conduct a cross-level review for DPP4 inhibitors and SGLT2 inhibitors after which the endocrine/diabetes mellitus space as a whole will be explored.

PRIMARY HEALTHCARE (PHC) AND ADULT HOSPITAL (AH) LEVEL STANDARD TREATMENT GUIDELINES AND ESSENTIAL MEDICINES LIST

- The following chapters have been reviewed and <u>ratified for publication</u>, with the respective NEMLC reports and relevant medicine review(s), following clinical editing:

 - Appendix II: Prescribing information for specific medicines published
 - The following items were reviewed by NEMLC:
 - Isoniazid Preventative Therapy (IPT) in Pregnancy In response to a query received on the use of IPT in pregnancy, the NEMLC confirmed, that in accordance with the updated evidence review¹ and previous risk: benefit deliberations on the use of IPT in pregnancy, IPT should be discontinued in all pregnant patients. Furthermore, the Committee recommended that for women who experienced an interruption to their 12 month course of therapy due to pregnancy, that the full 12 month course of treatment be reinitiated after pregnancy. These recommendations will be reflected in the updated HIV chapters.
 - Calcium carbonate STG dose wording in relation to elemental calcium NEMLC deliberated a proposal to align and provide better clarity for the STG dosing recommendation for calcium supplementation in the PHC CH: Obstetrics & Gynaecology, AH CH: Gynaecology and AH Ch: Nephrological/Urological Disorders to avoid possible dosing errors. NEMLC supported the recommendation that the relevant STG dose wording be amended to only include the elemental calcium supplementation requirements i.e., not the calcium carbonate salt dose, in the respective chapters.
 - GTN IV administration guidance Following the inclusion of a Section 21 formulation of on the EML, guidance on the dilution and administration of GTN IV, has been updated to include both 1mg/mL and 5mg/mL formulations, based on availability. The changes will be reflected in both the CH 20 AH Emergencies and Injuries and CH 3 Cardiovascular chapters.
 - Vitamin D dose for primary prevention of hip fractures NEMLC deliberated that in the AHL chapter 8: Endocrine Disorders, the STG recommended dose of vitamin D (Calciferol) 50 000 IU weekly is higher and outside the recommendation of the South African Medicines Formulary (SAMF) recommendations and other guidelines. NEMLC also considered that high intermittent doses of vitamin D have been associated with increased risk of falls in the elderly. NEMLC ratified the STG amendment to AHL chapter 8: Endocrine Disorders, recommending vitamin D (Calciferol) 50 000 IU every 4 weeks for the primary prevention of hip fractures. An erratum was published on the NDoH Knowledge Hub and NHI webpages on 22 May 2024.
 - **Benzathine benzylpenicillin injection (stock availability)** The Contract Management Unit of the Affordable Medicines Directorate has advised that the historical supply challenges regarding benzathine

benzylpenicillin injection have been resolved and that the national demand for benzathine benzylpenicillin injection can currently be met. Considering this, NEMLC recommended that the STG be updated to remove the restriction of benzathine benzylpenicillin to only pregnant women and children in the PHC chapter 12: Sexually Transmitted Infections (STI). A circular reflecting this change was published on the NDoH Knowledge Hub and NHI webpages on 06 June 2024.

- Initiation of Aspirin at Primary Healthcare level for reducing the risk of early onset pre-eclampsia in women with risk factors – An evidence summary for the initiation of aspirin at PHC level for reducing the risk of early onset pre-eclampsia in women with risk factors was presented to NEMLC. The Committee ratified the evidence summary, presented by the PHC and Adult Hospital Level ERC, with the recommendation that aspirin 150mg oral be recommended, until 36 weeks of pregnancy, for prevention of pre-eclampsia for all levels of care.
- Publication Layout: A proposal was made to remove the index of conditions and medicines from the PHC and Adult Hospital Level STGs and EML as currently, all finalised chapters are electronically published in pdf format and sections to the STGs and EML can therefore be searched electronically. This was accepted by NEMLC, and the change will be reflected in the 2024 editions of the PHC and Adult Hospital Level STGs and EML.

PAEDIATRIC HOSPITAL LEVEL STANDARD TREATMENT GUIDELINES AND ESSENTIAL MEDICINES LIST

TERTIARY AND QUATERNARY HOSPITAL LEVEL ESSENTIAL MEDICINES LIST

- The following items were reviewed by NEMLC:
 - Adalimumab and infliximab in individuals with luminal Crohn's Disease refractory to conventional therapy – The medicine review for the PICO relating to Luminal/Non-specific Crohn's Disease was presented to NEMLC. For Luminal/Non-specific Crohn's Disease refractory to conventional therapy, NEMLC recommended that adalimumab be the preferred agent due to price, favourable subcutaneous administration, and less infusion related adverse effects. It was also recommended that infliximab be made available as antibody development does occur. The Committee recommended that the annexure document developed for guiding use of adalimumab and infliximab in fistulising Crohn's Disease be expanded to incorporate luminal Crohn's Disease.
 - Third line Schizophrenia The reviews for quetiapine and aripiprazole in the third-line schizophrenia were shared for discussion with NEMLC. Based on the reviews, quetiapine was not recommended for inclusion in the management of third-line schizophrenia, as it is similar in terms of efficacy outcomes compared to aripiprazole and amisulpride, however it is inferior to aripiprazole and amisulpride in terms of adverse effects. It was recommended that aripiprazole be included for the management of third-line schizophrenia, as a step before amisulpride. A schizophrenia treatment algorithm has been developed and approved by NEMLC to outline the care steps from PHC to a higher level of care.
 - Ulcerative Colitis It was identified by the Tertiary and Quaternary Hospital Level ERC that there are currently no medicine recommendations for conventional/standard of care therapy in ulcerative colitis.

The Adult Hospital Level STGs and EML STGs recommends referral to a specialist for this indication. Conventional therapies: azathioprine, sulfasalazine and rectal mesalazine were included in the 2012 Adult Hospital Level STGs and EML but not included in the updated 2015 edition with no addition to the tertiary space. NEMLC approved the inclusion of these historically accepted use agents.



OTHER MATTERS


The following items were discussed by NEMLC:
